Getting Closer...

On October 2, the Synod of the Pacific assembly voted to petition the General Assembly Administrative Commission on Mid-Councils to approve the Plan of Merger between Kendall and Boise Presbyteries. We had a full cohort of Synod commissioners on hand to support the effort, and Cathy Chisholm and Rachel Yates offered an overview of the presbyteries' discernment process. The General Assembly AC will meet December 5 to consider the Plan of Merger. This will be the final ecclesiastical approval needed!

The Synod assembly also voted to continue 3 years of dual block grant funding for the Snake River Presbytery to give us a good financial start! These block grants are made possible by your investments and loans with the Synod. Thank you to the Synod! Read the assembly highlights here.
