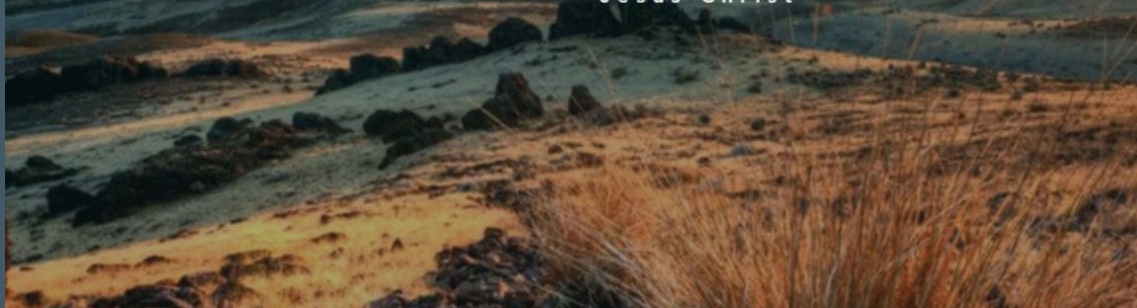


# Presbytery Meeting Highlights June 5, 2025

The Committee on Ministry brought two important pieces of business to the Presbytery Assembly. First, Chair JoAnn Thiry introduced Christine Caven, who was seeking to be enrolled as an Inquirer in the process of ordination to the ministry of the Word and Sacrament. Christine is currently serving as the Director of Family Ministries at First Presbyterian (Boise).



Christine spoke about her faith journey and then answered questions of the body. She was excused momentarily while the vote was taken and then welcomed back to resounding applause. Christine will be an Inquirer under care of the Boise Presbytery.

COM also presented the request of Rev. Dani Forbess and the Session of Covenant Presbyterian Church (Boise) to renew her contract for three years. We were gladdened to hear of the ministries in which she is involved, and the body unanimously approved the contract.

To facilitate the merger, the FMC presented a motion to release restrictions on certain funds, so they can be realigned to the priorities of the merged presbytery. The Presbytery approved this motion.
