

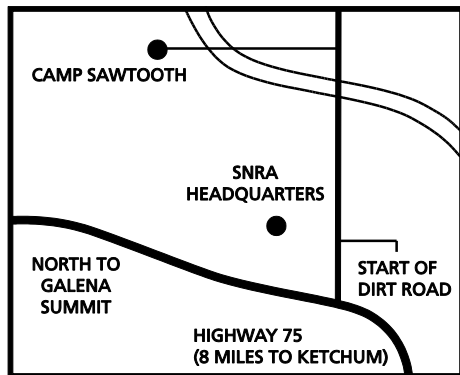
Directions to Camp Sawtooth

From Boise: I-84 to Mountain Home. Take exit 95/Hwy 20 toward Fairfield/Mountain Home/Sun Valley – 83 miles. Turn left at Hwy 75 toward Ketchum – 26 miles.

From Pocatello: I-86 at Pocatello, drive west-70 miles. Merge onto I-84 continuing west-37 miles. Take exit 174/Hwy 93; go north to Shoshone-20 miles. Continue north through Shoshone to Hwy 75 to Ketchum-56 miles.

From Ketchum to Camp: At the last stop light in Ketchum at Saddle Rd. continue 8 miles north. Turn right at Sawtooth National Recreation Area Headquarters (SNRA), continue 1.5 miles (the road changes to gravel), turning left onto bridge in to Camp.

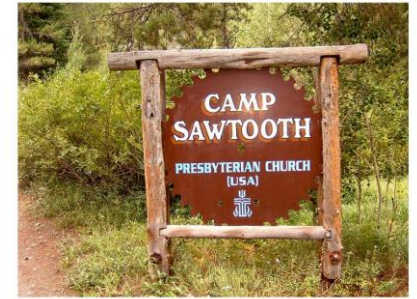

The camp is located 8 miles north of Ketchum, Idaho on 12 wooded acres in the Sawtooth National Recreation Area. For more than 75 years the Presbyterian Church has leased the property, which sits on the North Fork of the Big Wood River, from the Sawtooth National Forest.

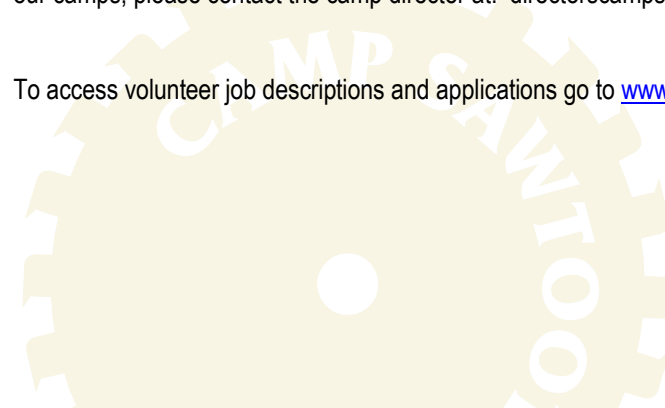
Volunteer Opportunities

Cabin Parents--are needed to assist our Program Staff. As a Cabin Parent you will be assigned a cabin and assist one of our Program Staff in the care of 10 to 12 campers. If you are a parent of a child who attends camp, you will receive a 50% discount for your child. There is a limit of 3 male and 3 female Cabin Parents per camp, so send your application early.

Program Staff-In Training (PSIT)--is an opportunity for teens to learn leadership responsibilities and to mentor younger campers. A PSIT will assist the Cabin Parent and the Program Staff in camp activities. The PSIT fee is 50% of the tuition of the camp they will be attending. There is a limit of 3 male and 3 female PSITs per camp so send your application early.

Camp Host – During residential camps, a Camp Host is needed to help with the daily operation of the camp. The Camp Host serves in weekly increments. A full description is available on the website.
