

**PRESBYTERY OF BOISE
STATED MEETING
MINUTES
November 2, 2024**

The Presbytery of Boise met for its stated meeting at First United Presbyterian Church, 400 Lake Lowell Ave., Nampa, ID, and by Zoom. Moderator TJ Remaley called the meeting to order at 10:00 am, a quorum being present, and offered an opening prayer. He invited first time elder commissioners and visitors to be recognized. Rev. Aaron Berkowitz then gave a welcome from First United (Nampa).

The Moderator presented the Consent Agenda that had been moved by the Transitional Presbyter/Stated Clerk. The motion was approved to include the following:

1. To record the business meeting of the Presbytery for purposes of drafting the written minutes that, when approved, will become the official record of the business of this meeting. The recording will not be retained after the draft minutes are prepared;
2. To approve the minutes of the stated meeting of August 8, 2024;
3. To approve the minutes of the special meeting of August 24, 2024;
4. To approve the agenda of the stated meeting of November 2, 2024;
5. To grant an exception to Session term limits to Kim Thompson, King Hill;
6. To receive the following written reports; any motions in them will be taken up separately:
 - A. Transitional Presbyter/Stated Clerk report
 - B. COM report
 - C. Mission Strategy Committee report
 - D. Financial Management Committee report and budget
 - E. Draft Ethical Conduct Policy
 - F. Presbyterian Women in the Boise Presbytery report
 - G. Minutes of Ordination Commission for Rev. Rob Wheeler
 - H. Nominating Committee report
 - I. Corporate election slate
 - J. Synod of the Pacific Assembly Highlights
7. To approve the following stated Presbytery meeting date of March 1, 2025 as a joint meeting with Kendall Presbytery, to be held by Zoom. Per the bylaws, communion may be celebrated at every meeting and shall be celebrated at the first stated meeting.
8. To recognize Rev. Jeanie Shaw (Mission Engagement & Support and corresponding member of Nevada Presbytery) and Rev Hannah Andres (BSU campus minister and UMC minister), with voice.

The Presbytery then entered into a time of worship. Rev. Berkowitz preached, and communion was celebrated. The Presbytery offered a time of remembrance for ruling elders and deacons who had passed away during the year.

Following worship, JoAnn Thiry, Chair of the Committee on Ministry led the Presbytery in celebration of the ministry of three commissioned pastors whose commission is ending this year: Jody Goode, Joey Mills, and Carol Bounds. JoAnn Thiry offered a prayer of thanksgiving and blessing for these three women.

TJ Remaley welcomed Rev. Hannah Andres, United Methodist pastor, to speak about the new ecumenical campus ministry at Boise State University. Students have chosen the name Sophia's Table. Contributions to the ministry and other mission partners can be made through the Presbytery's website (www.presbyteryofboise.com).

Priscilla Oja, Chair of the Mission Strategy Committee, presented the committee's motion for mission grants in 2025:

Motion to approve grant applications as follows:

Bethany - \$3000 for Next Chapter Food Pantry & Garden;

Homedale - \$4300 for general ministry support;

King Hill - \$3120 for general ministry support.

The motion carried.

Aaron Berkowitz presented a report from the Personnel Committee. He explained that the Synod of the Pacific will no longer be the employer of presbytery executive staff due to a change in their practices. The Personnel Committee therefore presented its **motion to separate from the Synod personnel system and make the Presbytery of Boise the direct employer of all staff. The motion passed.**

Rev. Jeannie Shaw was not present to make a report for the denomination's Mission Engagement & Support staff.

The Presbytery then considered three motions from the Financial Management Committee. **The first motion was to increase *per capita* from \$30 to \$34 in 2025.** This is needed because of increases at the national level and decreases in membership. It also puts us closer to Kendall Presbytery's *per capita* rate of \$40. **The motion passed. The second motion was to direct member churches to give Mission Support funds directly to the Presbytery of Boise which will, in turn, pass on support dollars to the Synod and General Assembly rather than giving to the Synod to disperse those funds.** Because of the decision to separate from the Synod personnel system, this will allow a more direct receipt of mission giving and payment of Presbytery expenses. **The motion carried. Finally, the Financial Management Committee moved approval of the 2025 budget as presented.**

Questions about the budget were answered. There are unknowns related to costs associated with the merger. It was noted that the merger does not have the effect of decreasing expenses when one takes into consideration hoped-for programmatic expenses and meeting costs. Sophia's Table is being funded largely by a Synod grant, with thanks to Marianne Paul for her application drafting. **The motion passed.**

Ruth Goldthwaite then presented the latest draft of the Ethical Conduct policy, which is our response to Book of Order requirements for an anti-harassment and anti-racism policy. Because the drafting team was not a formal committee of the presbytery, a **motion was made and seconded to approve the policy as presented in the meeting handbook. The motion passed.** The Transitional

Presbytery/Stated Clerk noted that congregations are also required to develop similar policies and will commend this Presbytery policy to Clerks of Session as a starting point.

In the absence of the corporate president Cindy Tyree, the Moderator next presented a motion from the Board of Trustees. **The motion was to elect JoAnn Thiry to the Nominating Committee for a second term and to serve as its chair. The motion passed.**

The Moderator then invited JoAnn Thiry to present the slate of nominees for 2025, as presented in the meeting handbook. **After she presented the nominations, the Moderator requested nominations from the floor. There were none, and the motion to elect the slate of nominees passed.** Some adjustments in the length of terms might be needed because of the merger with Kendall Presbytery.

The Presbytery took a recess from 11:43 am to 11:46 am.

Upon its return, the Presbytery heard the report from Vice Moderator Susan Knights about the work of the merger coordination task group, which is starting to meet with its Kendall counterparts.

Moderator TJ Remaley made a special note of the proposal contained in the Transitional Presbyter/Stated Clerk's report that the number of stated meetings per year be reduced from four to three. Because this is a bylaw change, it will be considered for a vote at the next stated meeting on March 1, 2025.

Prayer concerns and opportunities for community action were offered before our sending. With remarkable expediency, the Presbytery concluded its work before lunch. The meeting was adjourned at 12:10 pm, and the Presbytery enjoyed a wonderful meal prepared by the members of First United (Nampa).

APPENDIX I:

Transitional Presbyter/Stated Clerk Report

November 2, 2024

The Stated Clerks in the Synod of the Pacific exchanged presbytery minutes in September, during which time the minutes of the Boise Presbytery were reviewed. There were no exceptions to our minutes. In the October 2024 Synod assembly, the Boise Presbytery was granted an exemption to the Synod requirement for a racial-ethnic commissioner.

The third-year of our approved increases to minimum terms of call will be in effect for 2025. The minimum in 2025 will be \$49,000 for full-time pastoral services of a minister of Word & Sacrament, with full benefits, pension, disability & death coverage. It also includes four weeks of paid vacation (4 Sundays), two weeks (2 Sundays) of continuing education, and professional expenses. Twelve weeks of paid family medical leave is required for installed pastors. Per the Presbytery's Manual of Operations, these minimums should be considered as guidelines to prorate compensation for part-time calls, except that paid time off for vacation and continuing education leave should not be prorated.

Consistent with the recommendations of the Synod merger task force and Kendall Presbytery's schedule, the Stated Clerk is presenting a proposed amendment to the Presbytery of Boise Bylaws to reduce the number of stated meetings from 4 to 3 annually. This proposal is being presented, but not debated, at this November 2, 2024 meeting. It will be considered for action at the next stated meeting.
